The aim of the AQC is to validate individual applications for Demeter recognised advisors within the International Advisory Quality system. For this task, the AQC evaluates the peer reviewer's assessment using the completed Entry Verification checklist, and the abstract of the portfolio to decide on approval of the peer review process.

The AQC decides on applications preferably by consensus but if not possible, through a simple majority of Committee Member votes. Members have experience with peer reviews but abstain from doing peer reviews (except to renew their own) during their membership on the AQC.

The committee is composed of independent experts with experience in advisory work, certification and assessment in biodynamic agriculture. Members agree to a 3-year term and can be renominated. The members act to the best of their knowledge and beliefs, i.e. they are appointed as individual, independent persons responsible for their own actions and not as delegates or representatives of their country. Conference call meetings take place once per quarter, called upon by the coordinator of BFDI when applications are received.

The AQC consists of 5 members in Alphabetical order.

Andrea D'Angelo

I am a trained agronomist and began my biodynamic studies during my training in Brazil. Since 1998 I've been working as preparation-maker as well as cultivating the preparations and medicinal plants. I am researcher on the preparation plants with my current focus on Valerian. I work internationally as biodynamic and Demeter advisor. In Brazil I also promote biodynamics in social projects for the development of small-scale farmers. I am trainer for Biodynamics in different contexts.



Erhard Gapp

I trained as an agricultural engineer in Germany, have 10 years practical experience in biodynamic farming, and am involved in plant cultivation trials at the University of Hohenheim. Since 1996 I have worked in advisory for organic and Demeter farming, giving conversion and preparation courses, lectures and biodynamic events for farmers. Cooperation with Demeter certification. I also provide Demeter advice in the Czech Republic, Lithuania, Estonia, Latvia and Slovakia. For 15 years I have been a part-time inspector for organic and Demeter agriculture. I am currently on the board of Demeter Beratung e.V. Germany, the advisory association for biodynamic farmers.
